Women's shelters were the topic of the last one, and it was very encouraging to know that there are several good shelters to help women in need temporarily from domestic violence and abuse. I am also particularly thankful that one of the women that I am mentoring has become a regular participant of these events.

Another connection that God made was a timely text message from a roommate, from way back when I was still in Edmonton, who now lives in Japan. She is not a believer, but she has a friend who has many questions about the Bible and wanted me to connect with her. I found out she lives in Tsu city, where I was going to go visit in a couple of weeks' time! I said, "Let's meet at the church," in hopes that she would attend there. I was praying that she would, and God answered that prayer! I just found out that she has been going to church there regularly to worship and has recently started attending Bible studies, too.

My monthly connection times with the ladies that I am mentoring are the times that I most cherish. I find the Holy Spirit guides our conversations and helps us to see God at work in our daily lives. There are times we weep together and also rejoice together. I see the work of the Lord in each of these women and continue to look forward to see how God uses each of them.
